

APPLICATION FOR SPORT FISHING, HUNTING AND TRAPPING IDENTIFICATION CARD FOR SENIOR ALASKA RESIDENTS

Alaska residents who are 60 years of age or older and meet the Department of Fish and Game's residency definition on the back of this form are eligible for a senior identification card (PID) in order to hunt, sport fish, and trap for free.

Applicants must be physically present in the State of Alaska to apply. Applicants who complete the form and meet age and residency requirements will be issued a PID card within 1 - 4 weeks.

If at any time a PID card holder is no longer a resident of Alaska (see definition on back), their PID card is immediately void. If your contact information changes, you must notify Fish & Game Licensing within 30 days.

The following situations disqualify applicants from receiving the PID; there may be others:

- Having a resident hunting/fishing license in another state.
- Being registered to vote in another state.
- Receiving benefits under a claim of residency in another state, territory, or country.
- A person who otherwise does not qualify as a resident may not qualify by virtue of an interest in an Alaskan business.

The number printed on your PID should be used in lieu of a sport fishing, hunting and trapping license number in all instances where a license number is required (e.g. draw applications, resident big game tags, harvest tickets, etc.). Also, you are not required to purchase a king salmon stamp to fish for king salmon or an Alaska state conservation stamp to hunt waterfowl.

I have personally reviewed this application and hereby certify that all of the information provided is true and correct and that I understand this information may be subject to public disclosure. My right to obtain or exercise the privilege granted by a sport fishing, hunting, or trapping license is not suspended or revoked in another state. (NOTE: Making a false statement, or omitting a material fact, is subject to a maximum penalty of \$10,000 or one year imprisonment, or both, per AS 11.56.210 and AS 16.05.420.)

ALASKA RESIDENT AS 16.05.415(a) and 16.05.940(27): "resident" means, • a person (including an alien) who is physically present in Alaska with the intent to remain indefinitely and make a home here, • has maintained that person's domicile in Alaska for the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding this application for a license, • and is not claiming residency or obtaining benefits under a claim of residency in another state, territory, or country; • a member of the military service or U.S. Coast Guard who has been stationed in Alaska for the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding this application for a license; or • a dependent of a resident member of the military service or U.S. Coast Guard who has lived in Alaska for the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding this application for a license. A person who does not otherwise qualify as a resident may not qualify by virtue of an interest in an Alaska business.

AS 16.05.415(b): A person who establishes residency in the state in accordance with the residency provision above remains a resident during an absence from the state unless during the absence the person (1) establishes or claims residency in another state, territory, or country; or (2) performs an act, or is absent under circumstances, that are inconsistent with the intent required under the residency provision above.
